

# TATTERSALLS SALES DOCUMENTATION NOTICE ONLINE SALES

Individual Lot requirements may be found in your Tattersalls Online Account. If you have any doubts regarding Sales documentation, please consult your veterinary surgeon or contact the Bloodstock Department at Tattersalls. Test results and completed forms should be uploaded to your Tattersalls Online Account in advance of the Sale. These will be approved by the Bloodstock Department. Failure to lodge the correct documentation may result in horses being withdrawn.

# **MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS**

#### **COVERING CERTIFICATES (MARES BELIEVED IN FOAL) (Condition of Sale 10.4)**

A paper covering certificate must be lodged with Tattersalls or written notification must be received from the appropriate Stud Book Authority that the covering has been recorded electronically. Broodmares must be registered with Weatherbys or the appropriate Stud Book Authority.

# **EHV-1,4 (RHINOPNEUMONITIS) VACCINATIONS (IN-FOAL MARES)**

It is a compulsory requirement for in-foal mares at 5 months gestation or more to be vaccinated against EHV-1,4 details of which must be recorded in the passport.

#### **INFLUENZA VACCINATIONS**

<u>Yearlings (Two-Year-Olds in February Sale)</u>: As a minimum, Lots must have been given the first 2 vaccinations of the primary course.

**Broodmares:** Full vaccination history and must include an up-to-date booster.

<u>Horses In Training</u>: Lots must have had a complete course of vaccinations in accordance with current BHA requirements. Please ensure that all details of vaccinations are recorded in the passport. If in doubt, please consult your veterinary surgeon.

### **PASSPORTS (ALL LOTS)**

All Lots must be microchipped, and passports updated with Weatherbys. For Lots issued electronic passports (e-cards) by Weatherbys, these should be kept with the passport.

Please check that the markings in the passport match those of your Lot. Discrepancies must be notified immediately to the Stud Book Authority that hold the registration details of the Lot. Please also ensure that the Medicinal Treatment section of the passport (either A or B) is completed prior to Sale. Where a passport does not contain this section, please contact Weatherbys or the relevant Stud Book Authority to update the passport in advance of the Sale.

### PREGNANCY CERTIFICATES (MARES BELIEVED IN FOAL) (Condition of Sale 10.5)

Must be completed by your veterinary surgeon and dated within 30 days of the first day of the Sale.

#### **STRANGLES CLEARANCE DECLARATION**

A Strangles Health Declaration should be submitted via your Tattersalls Online Account <u>at least 7 days before the start of the Sale</u>.

# **VETERINARY CERTIFICATES (FULL FIVE-STAGE REQUIRED)**

It is mandatory for any Lot which is described as a Yearling (other than prior to 1st July), a Two-Year-Old (prior to 1st April), a Store, a Horse in Training or a Point to Pointer to be offered for sale with a pre-sale veterinary certificate dated within 14 days of sale. This should be completed on the Tattersalls approved certificate by a veterinary surgeon appointed by the Vendor and uploaded to the Tattersalls Online Auction website by 5:00pm on third day before the day on which bidding is scheduled to commence.

# **OPTIONAL REQUIREMENTS (Not mandatory but strongly recommended)**

# CONTAGIOUS EQUINE METRITIS (CEM) CERTIFICATES (STALLIONS, MARES & FILLIES IN/OUT OF TRAINING. Not required for Low Risk 2-year-old fillies)

For swab requirements, please refer to the CEM Regulations Notice at our main website, www.tattersalls.com

EQUINE VIRAL ARTERITIS (EVA) CERTIFICATES (STALLIONS, MARES, FILLIES & COLTS IN/OUT OF TRAINING)

<u>NOT</u> required for Geldings/Foals/Yearlings, Two-Year-Olds in February Sale, Craven Breeze Up and Guineas Breeze Up Sales. Your veterinary surgeon should take a blood sample <u>within 30 days of the first day of the Sale</u> (Enzyme-Linked Immunosorbent Assay (ELISA) or Serum Neutralisation Test (SNT) are both acceptable).

Lots should wherever possible be isolated after sampling. Samples must be sent to one of the following as appropriate: APHA Weybridge, Newmarket Equine Hospital (NEH), Rossdales Laboratory (Newmarket), BioBest Laboratories (Pentlands Science Park, Penicuik, Midlothian), BioTe Veterinary Laboratories, Donnington Veterinary Group (Newbury), The Irish Equine Centre (IEC) or Irish Department of Agriculture, Liphook Equine Hospital, Rainbow Equine Hospital (Malton) or to an accredited Laboratory in the country of export approved by the local Stud Book Authority.

Where the initial test proves positive, the Lot should be isolated and re-sampled 14 days or more after the initial sampling to see whether the titre is equal to or less than the initial reading.

#### FILLIES' EXAMINATION CERTIFICATES (FILLIES IN/OUT OF TRAINING)

Vendors may arrange for their veterinary surgeon to complete this form. Please note that certificates are not accepted for 2-year-old fillies. Certificates should be dated within 30 days of the first day of Sale.

# PRE-SALE PIROPLASMOSIS TESTING (Condition of Sale 26)

If submitting a pre-Sale test, a blood sample should be taken within 15 days of the Sale and be sent to an approved laboratory for testing by c-ELISA & Indirect Immunofluorescent Antibody Test (IFAT). If the result is positive or doubtful, an announcement will need to be made at time of Sale in order to preclude testing and return.

Optional testing requirements for the post-sale movement of GB-based Lots (strongly recommended)

#### **EQUINE INFECTIOUS ANAEMIA (EIA)**

• EIA testing must be carried out using the Coggins method and a blood sample should be taken within 70 days of the Sale and sent to the APHA Weybridge Laboratory.

#### **30-DAY HEALTH DECLARATION AND 40-DAY RESIDENCY DECLARATION**

- The approved wording template as per our main website, <u>www.tattersalls.com</u> must be used.
- Part 1, the 30-day Health Declaration, should be completed by your veterinary surgeon and Part 2, the 40-day Residency Declaration, should be completed by the Vendor or the Vendor's Agent.
